The Pastoral Studies Program is designed for men who sense God's leading to be a pastor or assistant pastor in a Baptist church. The Pastoral Studies' curriculum provides the student with biblical and theological knowledge, practical training, leadership, preaching and teaching skills. Missions, evangelism, nurturing believers, and church planting are also emphasized.

Upon completion of this program, students should be able to:

1. Demonstrate an ability to formulate a philosophy of ministry with a clear mission statement.
2. Demonstrate a comprehensive biblical and theological knowledge of Scripture.
3. Develop convictions and practically apply God's truth in themselves and to others.
4. Develop a worldview consistent with the biblical view of human need.
5. Appreciate, promote and support the cause of worldwide missions.
6. Win the lost to Christ, edify the saints and evidence a willingness and ability to do the work to which God has called them.
7. Prepare and deliver biblically sound sermons in a compelling manner.
8. Plant, renew and/or maintain a Baptist church effectively.
9. Demonstrate proficient management and communication skills necessary for pastoral leadership.
10. Understand the roles of the pastoral staff.
11. Biblically counsel and guide people.
12. Administer the church ordinances, conduct weddings, funerals, conferences, meetings, and other related functions of the Baptist church.

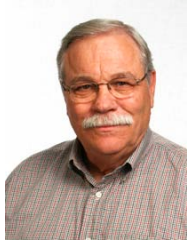

8. Demonstrate a level of computer information system knowledge that enables them to adapt to a business' electronic system and understand technologies throughout a business;
9. Evaluate the ever-changing work environment and the forces stemming from all aspects of society;
10. Enhance the interests of an organization's stakeholders;
11. Demonstrate an understanding of ethical responsibility in relation to the community;
12. Demonstrate a core of ethical standards that guide and direct decision-making and business behavior according to a high level of personal integrity.

It is the mission of the Elementary Education Department to provide a holistic education to pre-service teachers in preparation to meet the diverse learning needs of children in the 21st Century. Professional preparation includes gaining a broad knowledge and understanding of the world from a theistic point of view and acquiring the pedagogical skills to communicate and instill this knowledge and perspective in children.

Upon successful completion of the prescribed curriculum, students should be able to:

1. Recognize and integrate biblical principles into all areas of professional life;
2. Demonstrate competence as they serve their students, school and Lord through;
 - acquiring a balance of knowledge in general, professional and biblical studies.
 - demonstrating the ability to prepare and organize effective instructional materials.
 - implementing effective assessment of students' needs and progress.
 - demonstrating effective written and oral communication skills.
 - demonstrating the effective use of technology in students' learning
3. Demonstrate professional development and Christian refinement by;
 - demonstrating a commitment to self-improvement in personal, spiritual and professional growth.
 - exhibiting the ability to create and maintain an effective learning environment.
 - reflecting professionalism and Christian refinement in personal appearance and behaviors as well as in relationships with students, parents, colleagues and administrative leadership.
 - recognizing the importance of developing an effective working relationship with colleagues, parents and the community;
4. Demonstrate effective skills in teaching all subject areas to children of diverse backgrounds, needs and abilities;\
5. Demonstrate a love for children and recognition of the value of every child.

Departmental Standards (Subject to change per state regulations.)

Elementary Education students must have an ACT score of 19 or SAT equivalent to enter the department.

The following policy applies to students with less than an ACT score of 19:

Probationary Department Acceptance — ACT score of 17-18;

- Students must maintain a GPA of 2.5 (3 semesters) to continue taking PSEE courses.
- Based upon faculty review (attendance, performance, character)
- Students with ACT score of 16 or less will be required to retake the ACT to achieve either of the conditions stated above.
- Individuals unable to achieve an ACT score 17 (after retakes) may appeal to the chair for acceptance based on their GPA, attitude, CBASE scores, attendance and character.

Students must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 to enter 200 level education classes. A 2.5 GPA must be achieved and maintained in order to gain admittance to 300 and 400 level education classes. Elementary Education students who have two successive semesters of academic probation are not allowed to continue in the department.

The College Basic Academic Subjects Examination (CBASE) is administered each semester. Education students must pass all sections of the CBASE prior to gaining admittance into 300 and 400 level education courses.

A minimum grade of C is required in every professional education, math, psychology and English course. Students are to apply for admission to the Elementary Education Department after completing Foundations of Educations in the sophomore year with admission to occur before the beginning of the junior year.

In order to be admitted, the student must:

- Pass each subject area of the CBASE;
- Meet departmental standards as described above;
- Obtain the recommendation of the Elementary Education Department

Elementary Education students must create a Teacher Work Sample (TWS) as part of graduation requirements. This TWS is started in the PSEE 231 Professional Seminar I class and continued throughout the remaining course work.

5. Demonstrate a commitment to self-improvement in personal, spiritual and professional growth;
6. Develop a theistic worldview and biblical philosophy of ministry.

Students entering this course of study must have:

- Minimum composite score of 19 on the ACT;
- Cumulative GPA of 2.0 in order to enter the second year in this program;
- Minimum grade of C in all professional education, psychology, English and math courses.

The Music Department trains men and women to minister as worship leaders, teachers and performers in the local church. The following degree plans include a major or emphasis in Bible as well as music.

BACHELORS PROGRAMS

The Bachelor of Arts in Church Music is for students who want to enter the ministry as musicians. The Bachelor of Science in Music Education is for students who wish to teach in a public or private school, as well as lead in the church music ministry.

Upon completion of these programs, students should be able to:

1. Display proficiency in musical skills and knowledge;
2. Show an understanding of our musical heritage;
3. Perform acceptably as leaders of congregational singing and/or other church music leadership positions, or as music teachers in public or private schools;
4. Describe the role of music in worship and evangelism;
5. Verbalize the ethical and spiritual aspects of music ministry.

Music majors are required to:

1. Complete the prescribed course as outlined for the degree chosen.
2. Pass a piano proficiency test before enrolling in 400 level courses. This test is given at the end of each semester. In addition, keyboard majors must fulfill four semesters of accompanying and pass a hymn proficiency test. All students must continue taking Applied Piano, PSMA 100, until the proficiency is passed.
3. Read and follow departmental policies and procedures for the other co-curricular requirements as detailed in the Music Major Handbook.

Bachelor of Arts in Church Music requirements

The first two years of the degree are probationary. Students will be admitted to the Bachelor of Arts program if they:

1. Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 and no grade lower than a C in all professional music courses;
2. Display dedication to their ensemble and convocation attendance;
3. Show potential for success on their chosen applied instrument by progressing to level five;
4. Obtain the recommendation of the Music department.

Bachelor of Science in Music Education requirements

The first two years of the Bachelor of Science degree are preparatory for the educational component, which begins in the junior year. Students who seek to major in Music Education must:

1. Score a minimum of 19 on the ACT test;
2. Pass the College Basic Academic Subject Exam (CBASE);
3. Pass the music section of the Praxis II test and complete a portfolio;
4. Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.5 and a minimum grade of C in all professional music and education courses.

It is recommended that Music Education majors take Bible classes through distance education to reduce the semester loads.
